# IV PROGRAM UPDATES

# A. MESA Engineering Program (MEP)

# 1. Technology Career Fair

Natasha reminded members that the fair will be held on February 17, 2000 at Montezuma Hall on the SDSU campus. She also asked members to send in registration forms as early as possible to secure an exhibit. Natasha shared copies of a memo specifically developed to help industry members and recruiters understand the difference in fees charged by the MEP vs. Career Services for the Career Fair.

# 2. NAMEPA Conference and Membership

Theresa shared the NAMEPA databook, membership directory and newsletter along with vision and mission statement with the board. She explained that the organization National Association for Minority Engineering Program Administrators is design to provide networking and professional development with and for MEP Directors. Steve Wallace mentioned that by networking with other MEP Directors to recruit from a greater pool of students. Theresa mentioned packets of information can be sent to anyone interested in the organization.

# 3. MESA Program Enhancement Grant

After submitting several grant proposals to MESA Statewide, MEP was awarded a \$4,000 grant (part of funds given to MESA Statewide from Pac Bell). This grant was granted and will be used specifically for recuiting

alumni and new industry partners to the board on behalf of MEP and MESA. The staff is currently contemplating ideas in which these funds can be used and this objective can be reached.

# **B.** Mathematics Engineering Science Achievement (MESA)

## 1. New Staff

MESA/MEP has hired two new staff members to assist in reaching program goals. Angelic Willis has been hired as Office Mgr./Assistant to assist both MEP and MESA in everyday office duties and responsibilities. Charmaine Ferrer was hired as Counselor for the MESA program to provide counseling to MESA pre-college students. The Counselor position is part of a statewide restructure of the MESA program to help students decide on majors, enter college etc.

# 2. Guest Speakers and Tours

Robert gave a special thank you to Jose Luis Gomez at CALTRANS and Chairperson, Steve Wallace who both referred speakers to the MESA program. He mentioned that additional speakers are still needed. Robert shared a speaker packet with members of the board. Robert is also opened to have students' tour industry facilities such as Sundstrand that was toured in the Fall semester.

# 3. PSAT Testing 9th & 10th Graders

This event will take place on January 29, 2000. Proctors are need and will start at 8:30 am to 12 noon. This year 130 students were tested. It is estimated that test familiarity can increase points for students as early as Junior High School.

# 4. MESA Contest Preliminaries

On February 26, 2000 150 to 200 Junior and Senior high students will compete in hands on projects on the SDSU campus. Judges and proctors are needed to judge the different competitions. Robert asked members of the board to share this information with their engineers and refer them to MESA if they are interested in participating. Also company demos are welcome if you have technology you would like to share with students during their break from competitions. Contact Robert Goode is interested in participating at this event.

# C. Student Chapter Organizations

# 1. Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers (SHPE)

Albert Martinez, Vice President, shared information with the membership. The following activities will take place this Spring: The Junior High Conference will be held on April 1, 2000 and will include a day of science for approximately 300 junior high students. 13 members will attend the SHPE NTCC 2000 in Washington DC January 26th-30<sup>th</sup>. # 1. Shadow Day

Shadow Day evaluations were originally sent by email, unfortunately the email had a virus. Therefore packets were made available at the meeting. Natasha also mentioned that this was the lowest turn out for students and industry both. This year 46 students total attended 11 companies for Shadow Day, 16 of the 46 were MESA high school students. Compared to previous years we've had approximately 100 students (half MEP and half

MESA) with approximately 20 companies. Natasha gave several reasons for the low turn out including: Some large companies have developed their own Shadow Program and therefore are unable to participate in this Shadow Day, the industry is booming and companies cannot afford to take the engineers off majors projects, CE majors were especially hard to recruit - the number of CE majors at the college are down (from 471 in Fall 94 to 252 in Spring 99), dealing with students schedules and finally students with internships and jobs find it hard to take time away from work. The MEP and MESA staff will work next year to improve the numbers for Shadow Day with industry's assistance.
