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Introduction

The Zoological Society of San Diego (ZSSD) is an organization that fosters awareness for biodiversity, wildlife, and conservation.

The ZSSD Vision:

"To become a world leader in connecting people to wildlife and conservation".

The ZSSD Mission Statement:

"The ZSSD is a conservation, education and recreation organization dedicated to the reproduction, protection and exhibition of animals, plants and habitats".

Therefore, in collaboration with the education department, the Zoo has put together different programs throughout the year to accomplish this objective.

The San Diego Zoo Camp is one of these mainly programs where children from kindergarten through seventh grade meet and each grade level focuses on a different subject. These subjects include insects, birds, reptiles, habitats, zoo jobs or animal behaviour, respectively. Incorporated into the summer are animal presentations, behind the scenes, crafts, games and activities.

World Wildlife fund (WWF) is an organization that "protects the diversity of life on earth, and supports individuals and institutions that carry out practical and scientifically based conservation projects", such as the Zoo by contributing with educational guides to update information and give some teaching strategies.

Aim

- To implement creative thinking about how we can best make green choices that will impact wildlife and biodiversity.
- To provide interest to explore new ecofriendly and practical ideas that will benefit our environment, thus, making our world a better place to live.
- To foment environmental awareness; reuse, reduce and recycle.
- To make learning an enjoyable experience for children and the public in general, including program aids, teachers, directors, employees and visitors.

Method

Zoo Camp has a different topic for each grade level, each of which will contain a session A and B; each child can attend camp for as long as two weeks; the first week being session A and the following week being session B.

Animal Presentations- learn facts about the animal, they are allowed to touch depending on the animal.

Crafts- The Zoo reuses toilet paper tubes, newspaper, egg cartons, plastic bottles, etc. to make fun crafts for the children.

Animal Keepers- children learn the how, when, who and what of the animals from keepers.

Behind the Scenes- understand the design and appearance of animal enclosures.
