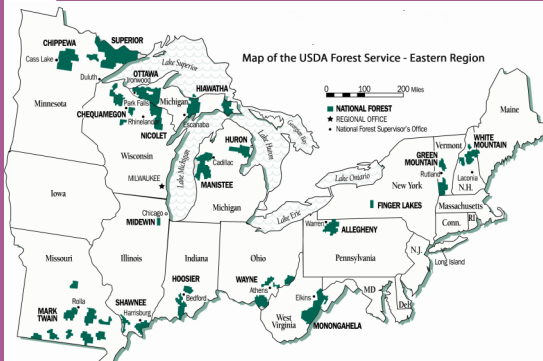


Eastern Region Facts

Recruiting High Performing Employees

Eligibility Criteria:

- Must be at least 16 years of age & U.S. Citizen
- Good academic standing in school
- Enrolled/accepted as a student taking at least half-time academic/vocation/technical course load in pursuit of a degree, diploma, or certificate.

Program Requirements:

- Written agreement between the Forest Service, academic institution, and student.
- 640 hours of career related work prior to completing all educational requirements.
- Grade Point Average (GPA) of 2.5 or higher on a 4 point scale.

- Current transcripts
